

Memorandum of an "Agreement" made this day; by and between;

A.B. Decourcy and Co, Church Organ Builders, Boston Mass; party of first part and

Reverend James J O'Brien, Rector of the Church of St Catherine of Genoa, Somerville Mass; the party of the second part; to wit:

The party of the first part, A.B. Decourcy and Co, agree to furnish, the "pipe organ; now at the Presbyterian Church, Sewickley Pa, built by Jardine & Sons, (free and clear of any encumbrance or claim) and transport it to the St Catherine of Genoa Church, Somerville Mass, and erect according to design as may be agreed on, and deliver the said pipe organ, tuned, and adjusted; ready for use; with a suitable kinetic Electric Blower for the sum of:

(Sum of One Hundred Dollars \$100.00)
Payable as follows: one thousand dollars, as partial payment to secure the

Sewickley Organ, and suitable "Blower"; (see specification attached) and the balance, in such payments as may be agreeable, and convenient, to the Rev

James J O'Brien, Rector of St Catherine of Genoa Church; final payment of this be made if possible; on or about September 1st, 1915, upon completion of this Organ and Blower in the Church.

In this agreement, the said A.B. Decourcy and Co, agree to furnish all the galvanized piping to connect the "Blower" to the Organ; and all necessary automatic attachments, control valve &c, and attach the blowing "system" to the Organ, ready to use; except the electric wiring, which must be done by the local or "contracting" electricians; by the rules of underwriters, and the local electrical inspectors.

The Party of the second part; the Rector, Reverend James J O'Brien, agrees (in consideration, that the said A.B. Decourcy and Co, the party of the first part, transfer, deliver, and install "the Pipe Organ" and the "Blower, and complete the said contract, in a faithful and workmanlike manner) to pay to A.B. Decourcy and Co, the sum of

Payable as follows;

The party of the second part still further agrees; to furnish a suitable place to locate the "Blowing plant; and to furnish the wiring, to conform the electric current to the "Blower" said work and materials to conform with the requirements of the "underwriters and inspectors" of the city.
