THE OLD HUNDREDTH PSALM TUNE

This setting of the hymn "All People That on Earth Do Swell:
was arranged by Ralph Vaughn-Williams for the coronation of
Queen Elizabeth II in June, 1953.

In 1984 an Organ Committee was formed for the purpose of looking into the replacement of our old organ. The committee selected Dr. Don Williams of Ann Arbor as our consultant. They met with several organ builders and eventually selected Steiner-Reck Inc. of Louisville, Kentucky.

Construction began in the summer of 1985. Installation was begun in February, 1986, and completed in May of the same year. The instrument was consecrated on Mother's Day, May 11.

A series of three concerts has been planned for the dedication. The first features Dr. Williams, our consultant, on September 21, 1986, at 5:00 p.m.

The second will be an Americana program featuring five professional instrumentalists from the Ann Arbor area and will be held on January 18, 1987, at 5:00 p.m.

The third and final concert will be given by Dr. David Wagner on April 5, 1987, at 5:00 p.m.
